Dr Alexander Soobratty, Staff Specialist Palliative Care, Gold Coast Health

Chair of Session 1 - Pharmacotherapy 1: Drugs once banned that are now being assessed / becoming available

Alex Soobratty is a specialist palliative care physician who has a special interest in complex pain management, holistic care of patients and compassion.

His training has taken him across the country to explore work and health conditions in Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia and Tasmania. This diverse experience has instilled an appreciation of the challenges of rural and regional communities.

Alex has the ambitious goal of transforming the way that analgesia is delivered in cancer-related pain, especially by learning from the examples of others.

Aside from his medical interests, he keeps himself grounded with his hobbies like cooking, rock climbing and a love of all things science fiction.



Laura McCosker, Research Officer, Specialist Neurostimulation and Mood Disorder Service, Gold Coast Health *Psilocybin*

Laura McCosker is an early career researcher in public and mental health. Her PhD involved two investigator-led, multi-site trials that identified strategies to improve COVID-19 vaccination uptake in people experiencing homelessness. Laura currently works as a research officer and clinical trials coordinator in the Specialist Neurostimulation and Mood Disorder Service at Gold Coast Health. She supports studies about novel treatments for difficult-to-treat mental illness including ECT, TMS, ketamine, and psilocybin.







Dr Timothy Roberts, Staff Specialist Palliative Care, Gold Coast Health Clonidine

Dr Tim Roberts is a Specialist Palliative Care Physician with a commitment to patient-centred care, communication, and medical education. He began his medical career in the UK with a focus on Respiratory Medicine, before moving to Australia, where he was drawn to the compassionate, holistic nature of palliative care.

Tim is particularly passionate about improving access to palliative care in community settings. He is driven by the goal of expanding services that support people to remain at home and avoid unnecessary hospital admissions, especially in the final stages of life.



Dr Sigrun Gutjahr, Staff Specialist Psychiatrist, Gold Coast Health Ketamine

Dr Sigrun Gutjahr, is an experienced consultant psychiatrist and psychotherapist who has practiced on the Gold Coast for over 20 years in both public and private settings.

Sigrun has worked for many years with patients struggling with self-harming behaviours and runs Project AIR, a personality disorder service at Gold Coast Health.

Over the past 5 years her interest in psychedelic assisted psychotherapy increased while searching for improved treatment response in the large patient group with anxiety and depression. She trained with trainers from the Monash trial on Psilocybin assisted psychotherapy for anxiety disorders and with the principal investigators for the St Vincent trial in Psiocybin assisted psychotherapy in terminally ill patients. This study looked at death anxiety, adjustment to end of life as well as mental health. She will shortly commence as a therapist in the 3PAP trial, a multicentre trial run by Swinburne University, examining psilocybin in treatment resistant depression.

Sigrun sees patients for dynamic psychotherapy. Sigrun's special interests are treatment of personality disorders, anxiety, depression, medically unexplained symptoms and complex trauma patients.

She holds a Masters in psychotherapy and is a member of the Faculty of Psychotherapy of RANZCP.



Associate Professor Graham Grove, Staff Specialist Palliative Care, Gold Coast Health and Medical Director SPaRTa Chair of Session 2: Motor Neuron Disease

Associate Professor Graham Grove is a consultant physician in palliative medicine and the medical director of QLD's regional and rural palliative care SPaRTa service. He is affiliated with Bond and Griffith Universities. He undertook medical school and physician's training in Adelaide. Following this he completed a theology bachelor and ministry accreditation whilst concurrently undertaking advanced training in palliative medicine, both parttime. He subsequently has worked as a consultant in Adelaide, the UK and Queensland. His interests include point-of-care ultrasound, radiology in palliative care, cancer pain interventions, prognostication and end-of-life and medical ethics.



Dr Maneesha Bhullar, Staff Specialist, Gastroenterologist and Hepatologist, Gold Coast Health Nutrition and Feeding Gastronomies

In 2008, he completed his Bachelor of Human Biology (BHB) and Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBChB) at the University of Auckland and became a fellow of the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Radiologists in 2016. Dr Sean Hill, Medical Oncologist, Gold Coast Health Updates in Gynaecological and Gastrointestinal Cancers

Dr Sean Hill is a Medical Oncologist working at the Gold Coast University Hospital with special interests in the fields of breast cancer, tumours of the central nervous system and gynaecological cancers.

Sean completed his advanced training in medical oncology in multiple hospitals in Southeast Queensland before relocating to the Gold Coast to complete a joint medical oncology/palliative care fellowship and was awarded a consultant position in 2022.
